Read: Psalm 131

## Discussion:

- 1. How does the psalmist describe his attitude in this psalm? Why do you think he tells the reader what he is *not* instead of what he *is*?
- 2. How do you define being humble? What are the benefits of humility? How different is the Biblical view of humility from our society's view? See Luke 1:46-49; Matthew 23:12
- 3. What are some of the perils of choosing pride instead of humility? See Proverbs 4:10-13; 1 Timothy 6:3-6
- 4. The psalmist gives us the picture of a child contentedly laying in their mother's lap. What does calm contentment look like for you? See Philippians 4:10-13; Hebrews 13:5-6.
- 5. What is the psalmist's source of contentment? How is it different than settling for a bad situation? What is your source of contentment? Where do you need to cultivate with God an attitude of calm?

Application: Bring to God your questions and struggles with pride and anxiety.

**Prayer:** Almighty God, you are the only steady rock in our uncertain world. Thank you that we can rest in you. Amen
